- Intoxicated individuals are not welcome at the center.
- Respect the IPRC facilities and equipment.

The IPRC reserves the right to refuse membership/use of the center to anyone who fails to abide by these guidelines.

Safety + COVID-19

The IPRC is very concerned about the safety of its members and users. We require that you receive training before using certain items as misuse can cause bodily injury or damage to the equipment.

After receiving training from staff or volunteers please sign the **SAFETY TRAINING AGREEMENT** which certifies you to use the manual and electric stack cutters, as well as the electric saddle-stitch stapler. Please kindly ask the front desk volunteer if you would like to receive training on how to safely use this equipment.





Print Studios

The printmaking facilities at the IPRC are available to Studio Members who have completed the required intro workshop for the corresponding studio (e.g. completion of Intro to Letterpress is required to use the Berlin Family Letterpress Studio).*

Each studio is open to use during supervised open hours which can be found on the IPRC website.



BERLIN FAMILY LETTERPRESS STUDIO

The Berlin Family Letterpress Studio is a wonderful place to learn the historic craft of printing with movable lead and wood type. In addition to type, our presses can also accommodate mounted linoleum blocks and polymer plates (various Boxcar Bases available for use). The cost of consumables such as ink and solvent is included in the Studio Membership.

THE WEMAKE SCREEN PRINTING STUDIO


The WeMake Screen Printing Studio is a lively place to learn and develop your screen printing skills. The cost of consumables such as ink, emulsion, and the necessary chemicals to reclaim screens is all included in the Studio Membership. Please note we do not allow the use of plastisol in the studio.



SCREEN RENTAL

Studio Members can rent screens at no additional cost by checking in with the screen printing supervisor on duty. The screen rental period is two weeks.





IPRC RISOGRAPH STUDIO

Risograph (or "riso") printing is an increasingly popular way to make multi-layer zines, posters, and ephemera. These machines print one color at-a-time and are great for experimenting with overprinting and multi-color layering.



LEARN MAKE SHARE (LMS)

Our Learn, Make, Share series offers introductory, hands-on demos on a variety of the tools in our Print & Publishing Tool Library including our button makers, spiral and coil binders, stack cutters, staplers and photocopiers. These hour-long skill-shares are designed to introduce new & existing members to the resources available in the studios at the IPRC. Come take a tour, pick up new member materials, and learn a skill! Free for members, sliding scale for nonmembers. See our website for current offerings.

PRINTMAKING & STUDIO WORKSHOPS

We offer a range of studio workshops, including monthly Introductions to all three print studios: Intro to Risograph Printing, Intro to Screen Printing, and Intro to Letterpress. Other studio workshops vary from month to month but include Graphic Design, Bookarts & Book Binding, Relief Printing, and Paper Marbling.

CREATIVE WRITING

In addition to the Portfolio Program the IPRC offers occasional creative writing & creative expression workshops both in the classroom space and online.

INDIVIDUAL INSTRUCTION

Printmaking workshops will be scheduled as individual instruction for the duration of the pandemic. For ongoing Individual Instruction, see our website for current rates and details.

THE PORTFOLIO PROGRAM

Formerly known as the Certificate Program, the Portfolio Program is a yearlong course of study that combines creative writing workshops with hands-on experience in the IPRC's print studios. Working in small cohorts over the course of three 12 week terms, students create a portfolio of creative writing, 1-3 broadsides, print ephemera, book forms, zines, and art books. To showcase works in progress, students are invited to share during quarterly readings & open studios.

The program currently offers four areas of focus:

- PROSE
- POETRY
- ART BOOK
- COMICS/GRAPHIC NOVELS

The Portfolio Program accepts applications in the month of July & runs from September through June. See our website for additional information and application requirements.
